- **Who It's For:** Individuals with a bachelor's degree (or higher) in a non-nursing field who want to become Registered Nurses (RNs) and earn a master's degree of science in nursing with a focus in Population Health.
- **Length & Format:** 2 years
- **Pre-licensure Phase:** Gain eligibility to sit for the NCLEX-RN exam.
- **Master's Phase:** Develop leadership and advanced skills to excel in diverse nursing roles.
- **Curriculum Emphasis:** Whole-person care, critical thinking, evidence-based practice, and leadership.
- **Accreditation:** Program is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) and Western Association of Schools & Colleges (WASC).
- **Clinicals:** Rotations and hours included in curriculum and completed at Loma Linda University Murrieta Medical Center.

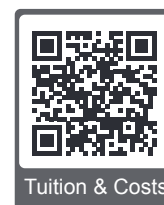

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- **Bachelor's Degree or Higher** in a non-nursing field from a regionally accredited institution.
- **Minimum 3.3 GPA** (cumulative & prerequisite).
- **Application (NursingCAS & secondary)**
- **Official Transcripts** from all colleges attended
- **Three Recommendations** (two must be from instructors)
- **Pre-entrance Exams** (TEAS & Critical Thinking)
- **Interview** (by invitation)
- **Volunteer/Work Experience** in a clinical setting recommended

## TRANSCRIPTS

You must submit transcripts from all post-secondary institutions that you have attended, regardless of whether or not it applies to your prerequisite coursework. This includes all colleges, universities, military credit, Advanced Placement, CLEP, and unaccredited schools. ***Official transcripts must be sent by the issuing institution(s) directly to NursingCAS for verification.*** Transcripts provided in any other manner are considered unofficial.

## FINANCIAL AID

Financial aid is available for eligible students. ***Begin early***, even before formal acceptance into the Nursing program. For current financial aid info, scan the QR.



## HOUSING & DINING

Housing is available on campus in a limited capacity in different residence halls. Students under 21 must live on campus, unless they are married or living with their parents. Scan QR for more housing and dining information.
