Graduate Student Writing Group

December 9, 2020

Graduate Student Association (GSA) has partnered with the Graduate Division to provide a virtual weekly writing group for the UC Merced graduate community. The Graduate Writing Group provides graduate students with writing support and accountability. Writing sessions will include an accountability check-in for students to set and share writing goals and a check-out to share what was completed during the writing time. Sessions will be divided into 25-minute writing intervals followed by a 5-minute break. Writer's will be muted and kept on camera mode to ensure everyone is working to reach their writing goal. Students who attend the writing group will have their name entered into a giveaway drawing.



Virtual Winter Dissertation Bootcamp

Dissertation Boot Camp is designed to provide dedicated writing space and time to a cohort of graduate students who would benefit from a structured, supportive writing community.

Activities Include:

- Virtual daily check-ins and check-outs
- Peer feedback
- Access to writing editors along with feedback
- Discussion of writing best practices based on resources provided

Criteria for Participation:

- Students have one or more writing tasks and can dedicate the full week of time to make progress. Writing tasks include the dissertation, dissertation proposal, qualifying exam, journal articles, book chapters, conference proceedings, and grant/fellowship proposals.
- If more students apply than there are seats available, preference will be given to Ph.D. students nearing completion of their degree, students working on their dissertations, and students who have not participated in Boot Camp more than once before.
- Participants are expected to be available for the whole week, with some allowance for other meetings and prior obligations.
