Grants season at UCHRI brings new open calls for funding to support University of California research projects. Applications deadline is February 3, 2025.

ENTANGLEMENT

UCHRI invites proposals that engage with this year's theme, **Entanglement,** from a variety of perspectives. The **Supplemental Entanglement Funding**, tied to the main Faculty Working Group category, is designed specifically for such projects.

INDIVIDUAL GRANTS FOR UC FACULTY

Summer Research Funding

UC faculty are eligible to apply for \$5,000 summer research awards to support full-time work on a research project at any stage of development.
Activities must be completed during Summer 2025.

Underrepresented Scholars Fellowship Program

Looking for peer mentorship to navigate the unstated expectations of the academy? Currently entering its fifth year, UCHRI's mentorship program invites junior and-mid career scholars to apply.

COLLABORATIVE GRANTS FOR UC FACULTY

Engaging Humanities

Engaging Humanities encourages innovative, thoughtful projects that strengthen partnerships beyond the academy. Funding includes seed (up to \$5,000) and project grants (up to \$20,000).

Faculty Working Groups

Renewable Faculty Working Group grants support networks of scholars across the UC. Apply to receive up to \$15,000 for collaborative projects on a variety of topics.

Supplemental FWG Graduate Student Funding

Eligible Faculty Working Group project leads can apply for a \$5,000 supplement to support up to two PhD students substantively involved in the project.

Supplemental FWG Entanglement Funding

Faculty Working Group projects related to the theme of Entanglement and working in the tradition of public humanities can apply for another \$5,000.

UCHRI Manuscript Workshop and Research Development Program

Funded by AFD, Manuscript Workshop grants provide financial resources to junior and mid-career faculty members to convene an online workshop aimed at preparing their book manuscript for submission to a publisher. The program also organizes research development workshops and culminates in a writing retreat with an academic press editor.

GRANTS FOR UC GRADUATE STUDENTS

Graduate Working Groups

Graduate Student Working Group grants support networks of scholars across the UC. Apply to receive up to \$5,000 for collaborative projects on a variety of topics.

Medicine & Humanities

The Andrew Vincent White and Florence Wales White Scholarship provides up to \$27,000 for UC graduate students engaged in interdisciplinary humanistic research on medicine, broadly defined. UCHRI welcomes projects that approach problems of health, bodies, and medicines in unexpected and creative ways.

Dissertation Support

The Graduate Student Dissertation Support grant offers funds to support dissertation work for UC PhD students in the humanities and humanistic social sciences. Support may include travel expenses for dissertation research, books related to the dissertation topic, and fees for summer institutes likely to advance the dissertation.
